## 1. What is a logic framework?

Logic models are graphical representations that show how a program or intervention is designed to work. They outline the connections between inputs, activities, outputs, and outcomes, and can serve to convey program goals and objectives, as well as assist in the design, execution, and evaluation of the program . Logic models help evaluators identify potential gaps, inconsistencies, and areas for improvement in program design and implementation by mapping out the assumptions and theories of change that underpin a program. They also assist in creating evaluation plans and strategies, selecting relevant indicators and measures .
