

- Evals happening but no system
- Major drive from 2009 - M&E seen as means of improving public sector
- Policy Framework November 2011
- National Eval System established from 2012

Background





Overall situation with evaluations

- > 39 evaluations completed or underway covering \$5 billion
- > 11 selected for 2015/16, covering additional \$2,5 billion
- > 16/46 national departments now involved in evaluations

Approach

Unit of analysis - programmes, plans policies and systems
Focus - importance of progs
Types of evaluation - diagnostic, design, implementation, impact, economic - different stages of programme cycle

Repository (currently 119 evaluations)

People and organisations

Use evaluations for change



Utilisation = own + learn + believe + follow-up


Own = depts propose + select together + pay + participate


Learn = change culture = accept mistakes but learn

Believe = credible + independent (SP+DPME)

Follow-up = public + improvement plans + monitoring







Progress with National Evaluation System

- > 3 National Evaluation plans to date, 4th NEP just been approved
- ➤ **18 guidelines**, evaluation **standards**, competences, trained >600 government staff
- Building demand emphasising learning, reports to Cabinet, working with Parliament, publicising reports, training for DGs/DDGs in use of evidence
- > Evaluation Repository audit of evaluations since 2006, plus new 90+ evaluations on the website
- ➤ 2 provincial evaluation plans (WC and GP), working with 4 more provinces, and 5 departments have departmental evaluation plans, eg DSD developing coordinated evaluation agenda with provincial departments of SD.
- Cabinet focusing on results of evaluations

First signs of impacts

- ➤ ECD new ECD policy been developed including new focus on children from conception, rather than 2 years
- Grade R not having impact in poor schools moving from emphasis on quantity to quality
- ➤ **Nutrition for Under 5s** increased emphasis, target to reduce stunting from 21-10% in MTSF
- Business Process Outsourcing Scheme scheme redesigned and relaunched
- ➤ **Gov Coordination Systems** (clusters) developing new guidelines, strengthening secretariats and increasing role of Presidency, incorporated in 5 year targets of government
- > 8 improvement plans being implemented so far



Lessons from NES to date

- Utilisation focus is key keeping a demand-driven approach helps to ensure buy-in and likely use of findings
- 2. Must have **political will** to face challenges otherwise rather focus on monitoring
- 3. Need to work at **supply and demand** ends
- Not just about doing evaluations but need systems (standards, guidelines, training...)
- Need to develop capacity of evaluators, as well as government staff to manage system
- **6. Don't go too quickly** (in retrospect we had too many in year 2/3 and developed bit of backlog) need to maintain quality
- 7. Important to have a **coalition** across government to support evaluation, eg
 Evaluation Technical Working Group promotes collaboration and feeling that all
 contributing to establishing the system



Need to see **evaluators as partners** in the system – eg getting their feedback on how to strengthen the system



Role of donors in evaluation in SA

- ➤ Donors have funded some evaluations (DFID, UNICEF, 3ie) probably around 10% of NEP, so not a major role in SA
- > Also funded evaluations of own projects
- ➤ Individual depts eg DSD have had donor support for large evaluations eg Child Support Grant
- Donors also funded development of parts of the national evaluation system especially around capacity development and quality assurance
- > Very much a supportive role with us in the driving seat
 - While donor role has been limited it has been important

Suggestions for collaborative donor-partner work going forward

- > A regional project in Africa around M&E is being developed by SA, Uganda, Benin..., supported by DFID with CLEAR and 3ie, which will also have global linkages (eg to Mexico and Colombia). Room for other donors to support
- ➤ 3ie playing a key role internationally re impact evaluation (supported by several donors, especially DFID/Gates). Room for more support to 3ie by donors, and for middle-income countries to cost share
- ➤ Room for collaboration across countries supported by donors eg on standards, guidelines, capacity development, supporting learning and sharing as well as developing shared tools (eg improvement plan tracking system)
- > Countries must want to share what they do and avoid re-inventing wheels
- > Donors to use emerging country systems for their own evaluations in country
- > Donors to part-fund evaluations in country


