



## The Civil Protection System of Germany



#### Civil Protection in Germany on its different levels



Bundesamt für Bevölkerungsschutz und Katastrophenhilfe Fire brigades, rescue services and technical relief agencies rely on **vast numbers of volunteers**. These are well-trained, unpaid citizens who contribute their time to support the civil protection system in Germany.

Three examples:

**Fire brigades**: 1,1 million active fire fighters of whom 96% are volunteers

**German Red Cross (DRK):** 540 000 active members of whom 74% are volunteers

**Federal Agency for Technical Relief (THW):** 88 000 active members of whom 99% are volunteers








# The Floods of 14./15. July 2021 (with special focus on the Ahr Valley)

### The Floods of 14./15. July 2023



Precipitation amounts in mm 12.07.-15.07.21 Source: DWD


- From 12-15 July 2023, parts of Europe, including Germany experienced unusually high amounts of rainfall, with significantly more rain coming down within 24 hours than usually during the whole month of July.
- The specific **topography** of the Ahr Valley with steep slopes and a narrow river bed further exacerbated the situation.
- More than 180 people died nationwide (>130 in the district of Ahrweiler alone)
- Largest/deadliest disaster in Germany since the North Sea Flood of 1962, with

estimated direct **damages of over €30 billion**, incl. about €13 billion of public infrastructure and even more than that regarding private homes


### The response in (some) numbers...

- THW activated and deployed more than 99% of its local sections, making it by far its largest response in its 70 years of existence. A total of about 16,200 THW-members were deployed for a combined total of more than 2 million hours of operation.
- The Federal Police deployed over 7.500 staff during the first two months




- The **German Armed Forces** deployed up to 2,300 staff working for a combined total of 60,000 days.
- Staff of the three **relief organizations** ASB, DLRG and German Red Cross were involved for a combined total of over 130,000 working days. MHD, JUH and others equally were involved significantly.

#### Some identified challenges



The Ministry of Interior published its report on the Flood disaster of 2021 in March 2022. In it, the following priorities were identified:

- To strengthen civil protection (including training of crisis managers on all levels);
- To optimize structures/mechanisms of cooperation in a state of disaster;
- Climate adaptation / increased resilience;
- To strengthen warning infrastructure (e.g. cell broad cast, sirens);
- To strengthen individual resilience among the general population;
- To increase the use of digitalization for disaster response (e.g. digital situation maps);
- Direct and indirect measures for flood protection (incl. prevention);
- To review the option of a general, mandatory insurance against elementary loss.
